This week has brought challenges for all of us, here on campus as we implement pandemic preparedness protocols, and around the world. Yet, as I talk with students, colleagues, and friends, I've noticed a growing sense of community, a shared feeling that we're facing this crisis together. In a time when phrases such as "social distancing" are becoming part of our daily lexicon, I'm heartened by the fact that the opposite is happening. Not in the physical sense, of course, but in the way we are uniting to take care of each other.

I can think of no better example than the way Rams around the world stepped up for fellow Rams yesterday and today during what was scheduled to be our annual CSU Day of Giving. I was especially moved when I learned about an inspirational \$50,000 gift to our Rams Against Hunger program that will provide more than 6,500 meals to Colorado State University students struggling with food insecurity. And I'm thrilled to share that 71 donors supported our Infectious Disease Research Center, which is at this very moment working to create a COVID-19 vaccine. Seventy donors supported Ram Aid, a fund that helps students at risk of leaving CSU because of unanticipated expenses. 52 percent of the gifts came from alumni, while another 30 percent came from faculty and staff. Overall, 328 donors stepped up for CSU yesterday and today, and for that, I am sincerely grateful. I'm filled with gratitude for yesterday's demonstration of generosity, but not surprised. Ever since I joined the CSU family last July, I've witnessed the same spirit of giving and the same commitment to helping our students and our community and to making the world a better place.
