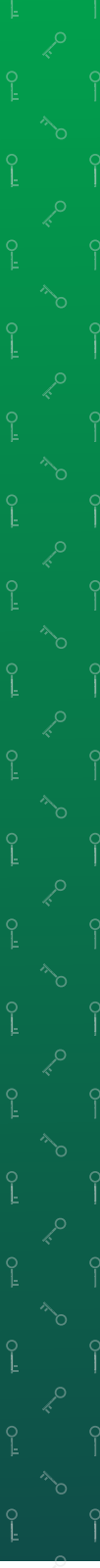

Gail Hogan, Heart Attack Survivor

I will never forget the day that I nearly died, Lynne.

I was a young journalist with a great career and I was just starting a family. The only way I found out that I had any type of heart issue was when I went into cardiac arrest.

Fortunately, my coworkers had recently been trained in lifesaving CPR protocols developed by the American Heart Association. They sprung into action and were the ones to keep me alive until paramedics arrived.

Jennie, I'm sharing my story because this issue is personal to me. In fact, chances are it's personal to

you, too.

Each year, more than 350,000 people in the U.S. go into cardiac arrest outside of a hospital. Sadly, about 90% die — but bystander CPR can double or triple the chances of survival.

Watch my story to see how CPR saved my life, and then learn Hands-Only CPR so you'll be ready to save a life if you're ever called upon.



After my heart attack, I learned a lot about life-saving CPR

- That women are often less likely to receive bystander CPR because common fears and misconceptions may prevent them from getting help. If my coworkers had second guessed themselves, I wouldn't be here to tell my story
- That the American Heart Association is the worldwide leader in first aid, and CPR — educating more than 22 million people in CPR each year
- And that Heart has continued CPR innovation, including developing Hands-Only CPR which was especially important during the COVID-19 pandemic

As you can see, the power to save lives is in your hands, Jennie. And with an uptick in cardiovascular events happening in the summer heat, it's more important than ever to get trained and be ready.

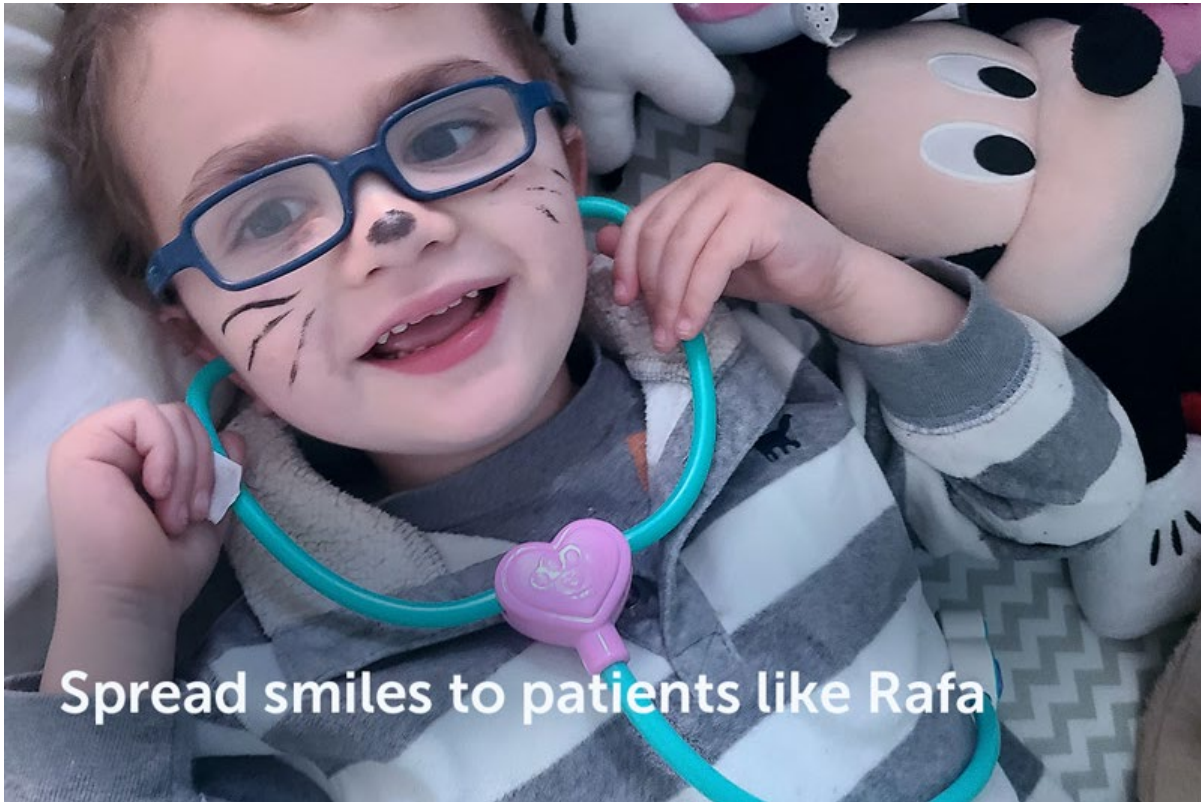

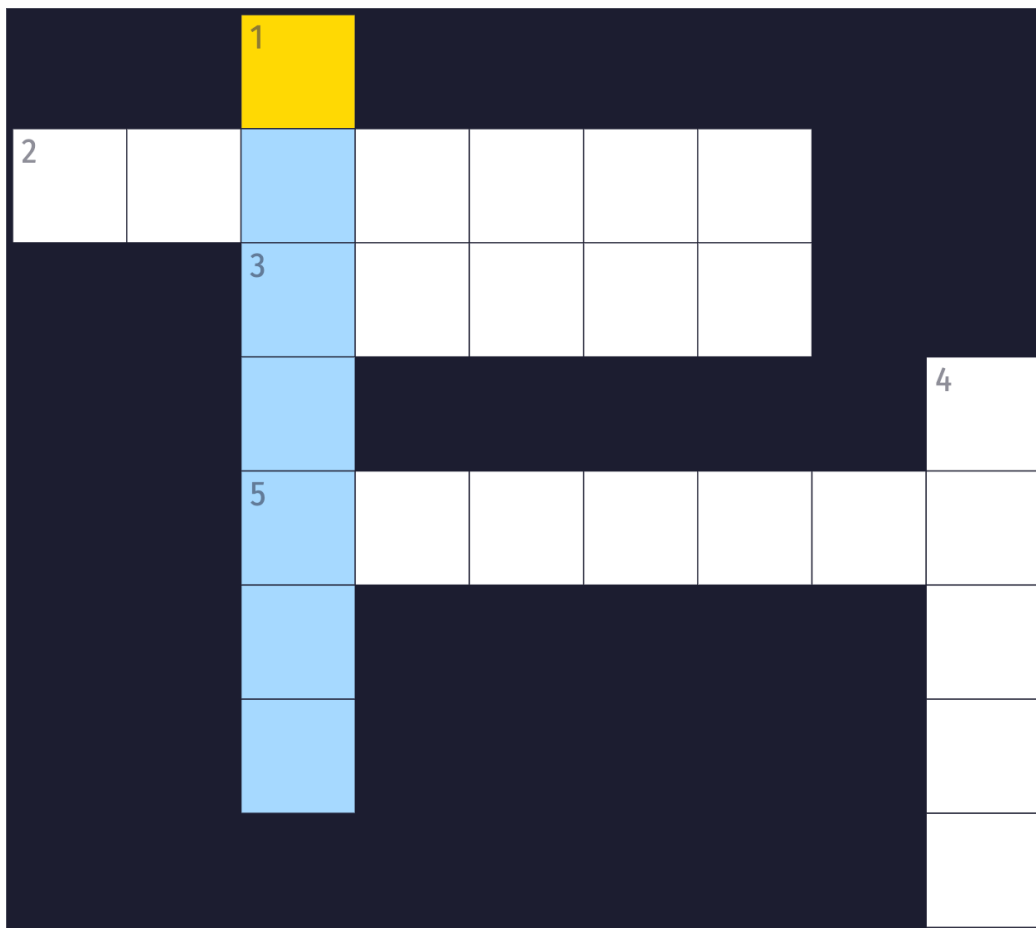

May you be inscribed in the book of life for a good year!

This Rosh Hashana postcard was given to the Krakowski family at the Bergen Belsen displaced persons (DP) camp in Germany. Don Krakowski later donated the card to the JDC Archives. Don, along with his sister and parents, were interned at the DP camp in Germany.

The ship atop the card announces the immigration plans of the family who sent the card to the Krakowskis, while the Hebrew wishes express their hopes that one day they will all reunite in Israel. The details of this card are beautiful- from the hand-cut heart shaped image of the family, encircled by a garland, to the handshake beneath, symbolizing heartfelt wishes of comradery and connection across the seas. Given that the card has survived 74 years, there is no doubt that the Krakowski family cherished these new year greetings long after 1948. **May this be a happy and healthy year for us all, made sweeter by the friends and family we hold dear.**

Formerly a concentration camp, Bergen Belsen became the largest DP camp in Germany. Working with the survivors' Central Committee of Liberated Jews, UNRRA, and others, JDC provided health care, supplementary food, clothing, emigration aid, and education and cultural programs.

The JDC Archives houses one of the world's most significant collections of modern Jewish history. Comprising the organizational records of the American Jewish Joint Distribution Committee (JDC), the world's leading Jewish humanitarian organization, the archives includes over 3 miles of text documents, 150,000 photographs, a research library of more than 6,000 books, 1,100 audio recordings including oral histories, and a video collection.

With records of activity in more than 90 countries dating from 1914 to the present, the JDC Archives is located in two centers, New York City and Jerusalem, and is open to the public by appointment.
