ENDOWED CHAIR SPOTLIGHT

Carmichael-Walling Chair of New Testament and Early Christianity

Dr. Jeff Childers first visited the Monastery of St. Catharine's at Mt. Sinai, Egypt, in February 2011, when he was invited to use the monastery's library for research.

At some point, you've probably noticed footnotes in your Bible that refer to other ancient manuscripts. Have you ever wondered whose job it was to work through those manuscripts before they could be referenced in footnotes? One of the people you can thank is **Dr. Jeff Childers ('89)**, Carmichael-Walling Chair of New Testament and Early Christianity.

Childers' work as a professor of New Testament and Early Christianity in the Graduate School of Theology, and the director of ACU's Center for the Study of Ancient Religious Texts (CSART), has taken him to libraries across the world, from Oxford to Paris, from the Vatican to Mount Sinai. In these libraries, Childers uncovers ancient texts and makes them accessible to a larger community for research and even devotional study. He gratefully credits the generosity and vision expressed by the donors who have endowed his chair for making his research and teaching possible.

"I am glad to be in a place that honors not only cutting-edge scholarship but also encourages the application of scholarship to ministry, the life of the church, and personal spiritual life," Childers said. "Chair funds enrich all of that immensely."

The Carmichael-Walling Chair has raised ACU's profile, Childers said, as a producer of distinctive

research. In the past few years alone, he has been invited to contribute to major works on New Testament textual criticism, the history of the Bible, groundbreaking translations of Church Fathers, the Antioch Bible, and encyclopedias on Early Christianity and Judaism. He has presented lectures worldwide, including in the U.S., Norway, Turkey and Italy, and in 2016 the Museum of the Bible invited Childers, in conjunction with CSART, to take the lead in a major international research project on the flagship manuscript in its collection.

Childers isn't the only scholar to benefit from the Carmichael-Walling Chair. Since 1987, the Carmichael Walling Lectures on New Testament and Early Christianity have brought 32 world-class religious scholars from across the globe to Abilene, helping make ACU a leader in the academic community. Moreover, the chair enables Childers to mentor and support graduate students, conduct unique research and mentor the next generation of ministers and religious scholars.

"My favorite part of holding an endowed chair at ACU is the way the environment encourages holistic approaches," Childers said. "I am given the chance to do research I love, yet that includes the opportunity and expectation of forming and equipping students for work and ministry."

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP SPOTLIGHT

Earl O'Quinn Memorial Scholarship Endowment

In August 2018, **Jason O'Quinn ('99)** drove from Dallas, Texas, to Abilene to meet with **Sarah Conley**, a senior criminal justice major from Wichita Falls who is a recipient of the Earl O'Quinn Memorial Scholarship Endowment. The scholarship is named for Jason's father, who passed away in 2013 from throat cancer.

Sarah talked about her studies and plans – she had considered law enforcement, but now she's studying for the LSATs and looking at law schools – and Jason shared his own senior-year-at-ACU memories, back when he thought he'd be a dentist (he's in the mortgage lending business). He then talked about Earl, a former "University of Texas hippie" who co-owned a small family roofing business in East Texas. He and his wife – a public school diagnostician, **Melinda (Haws '71) O'Quinn Martinez** – sent Jason and his sisters, **Traci (O'Quinn '93) Brown** and **Amy (O'Quinn '95) Mullins**, to ACU without incurring student loan debt.

When Earl died after a five-year battle, Jason immediately thought to create an endowed scholarship in his honor. The family plans to continue to give to the endowment to help make the ACU experience more affordable for more students. Jason told Sarah:

"My dad wasn't a great public speaker, and he ultimately lost his voice to a laryngectomy, so we felt that by funding this scholarship, it would not only be an opportunity to create a legacy, but would give him a voice once again. We couldn't think of a better way to allow his voice to be heard as it pertained to his support for Christian higher education. You've come here with an open heart to say, 'I want to be molded, changed and prepared to do Kingdom work.' That's true for whatever field you're in. And I can't imagine a better investment than investing in the children of God. That's what gets me fired up. We're all in the Kingdom-building business. We're in the business to bringing heaven to Earth. And we need students graduating from ACU and going into every facet of our marketplace to be the world changers we're called to be. That's why I drove out here this morning to take a picture and hug your neck because I've been told you're a Kingdom advancer and world changer, and I want to meet students like you every chance I get."

WHAT IS THE ENDOWMENT?

Endowment gifts and the support they provide make an extraordinary difference in defining the strengths, quality and success of Abilene Christian University. Spending from the endowment provides the third-largest source of funds to support annual operations of ACU, accounting for 15 percent in 2018.




An endowment is a fund intended to benefit the university every year in perpetuity. Unlike current-use gifts, which are spent completely for immediate needs, endowed funds are invested for long-term growth and a portion of the return on those investments is spent each year.


At ACU, our current distributions target is 4.5 percent per year. The most flexible endowment gifts are unrestricted, allowing the university to use resources where they are most needed. Endowment funds cannot be redirected to purposes contrary to donor instructions. For example, a donor’s gift restricted to supporting a scholarship cannot be repurposed to support departments. All such gifts honor in perpetuity the donor, the institution and those students and families who benefit from the support endowments make possible.

ACU’s endowment is a collection of more than 925 individual funds invested for the long term. Most of the funds have their own sets of restrictions and guidelines as to how they may be used. Some of these endowment gifts are more than 65 years old and reflect a donor’s wishes based on what was known or expected at the time of the gift.

INVESTMENT PHILOSOPHY AND POLICIES

Endowment investment policies are designed to maximize long-term results at an acceptable level of investment risk. Endowed gifts are invested in ACU’s pooled endowment, a globally diversified portfolio of assets including publicly traded stocks and bonds, hedged strategies, private equities, real estate and natural resources. The endowment’s target asset allocation – the percent exposure to each asset class – is shown as of June 30, 2018.





PERFORMANCE SUMMARY

The diversified nature of ACU's endowment has helped protect returns in a market environment that, during the past decade, has been characterized by significant volatility. Throughout this 10-year period, the endowment has produced an annualized return of 7.9 percent compared to the benchmark return of 6.5 percent annually.

Each year since 2006, ACU's returns for 10-year periods consistently ranked in the top 5 percent of all university endowment returns.

TYPES OF ENDOWMENT FUNDS

- **Unrestricted endowments** support the general purposes of the university.
- **Student scholarship endowments** strengthen our ability to attract and retain the most talented students, regardless of their ability to pay. Endowed financial support enables ACU to attract and educate one of the most diverse and selective student bodies among our peers.
- **Endowed chairs, professorships and fellowships** are powerful vehicles to recognize and invest in groundbreaking research, exemplary teaching and faculty leadership, as well as recruit and retain pre-eminent scholars.
- **ACU's departments, centers and programs** (including ACU Athletics) foster environments encouraging new areas for interdisciplinary thinking and collaboration, and advance innovative research and teaching. Endowed program funds provide ongoing support allowing faculty and staff, across a range of disciplines, to combine their unique expertise to tackle some of the world's most pressing challenges.

Our impact report provides our scholarship donors with basic directory information from their recipient(s) along with response to a max of four questions. The questions the recipient(s) answers:

1. A note of gratitude to the donor(s) for this scholarship
2. Why I chose my area of study
3. My Favorite Auburn Experience (if you are a current student) OR Why I chose Auburn (incoming students)
4. What this scholarship means to me

The directory information, answers to the questions, and a photo (if provided) merge into a document and print on #80 Text paper. An example of this is the **SampleProfileForSubmission.pdf**. The profile(s) pairs with a cover letter from our VP/President of the Foundation printed on #100 Text paper. The cover letter example is the **Schol Impact Rpt cover ltr 2019-19-JDP.pdf**.

The cover letter and profile(s) mailed in a sleeve like folder. This sleeve opens from the top so the documents slide into the pocket and will not fall out unless tipped upside down. The design of the sleeve example file: **Scholarship Presentation.pdf**. An image of the sleeve open: **scholarship sleeve open.jpg**. For those reports that had more than 10 pages, we bound them with two heavy-duty staples. Anything over 30 pages bound into a book (Images of the book are here as **Book1.jpg** and **Book2.jpg**). The presentation mails in a 9x12 envelope with a matching design to the sleeve (**scholarship envelope.jpg**) to provide a cohesive look.

This presentation was been welcomed with rave responses from our donors and University partners.





A Guide to Understanding This Endowment Summary

Spendable return is calculated at the end of each fiscal year (June 30) and is based on a formula that takes into consideration the prior year's spending adjusted for inflation in addition to the average of the endowment's market value for the previous six quarters.

Endowed gifts made to Berea College are invested in the Pooled Endowment Fund. The primary objectives of Berea's Investment Policy are preserving the inflation-adjusted value of the Fund, producing an average annual return over time that provides for real growth, and achieving competitive returns relative to appropriate benchmarks.


The following chart reflects the policy target asset allocation of the Fund:

An Endowed Fund, A Lasting Gift

Endowed scholarships play a key role in maintaining Berea's eight Great Commitments. In the absence of tuition income, the College relies on spendable return from the institutional endowment for approximately 75% of the unrestricted educational and general operating budget. Annual gifts and federal and state aid cover the remaining 25% of costs. This unique funding model allows Berea College to provide tuition scholarships to more than 1,600 students each year.

Endowed gifts at Berea are maintained in perpetuity, and only the return—never the principal—is spent to support lives of great promise.





The Center for Medieval and Renaissance Studies at Binghamton University was founded by Aldo Bernardo in 1966. Since the establishment of the Name of Fund in 1990, the fund has been crucial to the activities of CEMERS, as our programming during FY 2018 demonstrates. The fund's most important impact in the past year was to support the annual Bernardo lecture, which addresses a topic on medieval (especially Italian) literature or medieval intellectual history. The **28th Annual Bernardo Lecture** "Forgotten Models; the Lost Worlds of Medieval Rome and its Region" was given on November 8, 2018, by Carol Lansing, Professor of History at the University of California, Santa Barbara, in the President's Reception Room of the Anderson Center. The Fund paid for all the expenses related to the lecture, including the printing of invitations, posters, and programs, and an honorarium and airfare—as well as food and lodging—for the speaker, plus a reception for Binghamton faculty and students before the lecture.


This was a very successful event with approximately 60-70 people in attendance, including the donor herself, along with Binghamton faculty, students, and alumni, as well as community members. It contributed significantly to the academic prominence of CEMERS inside and outside of the University and increased student participation in our programming. The lecture was followed by a dinner at Remliks attended by the speaker and about a dozen CEMERS faculty members. While faculty mostly paid for their own dinners, the event was subsidized by the Fund, which also covered the cost of the speaker's dinner. The dinner facilitated a dynamic conversation with Professor Lansing about the conjunction of religion and power in medieval Italy. The Bernardo lecture is the highlight of CEMERS programming, sustaining Aldo Bernardo's vision of CEMERS as the locus of transdisciplinary encounters for research on the pre-modern at Binghamton University. Most of the lectures are subsequently published as individual booklets in a series of occasional papers sponsored by SUNY Press.

Another CEMERS initiative that the Fund supported in 2018 was the **Bernardo Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Studies**, which recognizes the achievements of Medieval


Studies majors. This year the award was given to graduating senior Victoria Zisser, who while at Binghamton University was also employed as work-study student in the CEMERS office and interned on our in-house journal *Mediaevalia*.

In fall 2018, CEMERS also hosted a ground-breaking international conference on “Medieval Unfreedoms: Slavery, Servitude, and Trafficking in Humans before the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade,” organized by Prof. Elizabeth Casteen of History, and a transdisciplinary speaker series on “Translation and Transformation in the Pre-Modern World,” organized by Prof. Jeanette Patterson of Romance Languages and Translation Studies.

The Fund has become the engine of CEMERS and of the program in Medieval Studies: it allows us to host an annual lecture on a topic related to Aldo Bernardo’s research areas and interests and supports a range of programs associated with the center’s teaching and research activities, such as graduate student travel grants for research in libraries and archives abroad (not awarded this year). All of us in CEMERS are very grateful to the donor for her continuing, extremely generous support, as well as for her warm friendship with CEMERS faculty.

Last year alone, more than 2,000 members of our community contributed over \$6.5 million to support our programs and initiatives that help change lives. In addition, more than 650 volunteers donated something just as valuable—time, energy, and passion to help our students learn and grow.

Thank you all for the incredible support you have shown this school and our students, faculty, and staff. I look forward to meeting you, communicating with you, and collaborating with you throughout the year ahead and beyond.



REUNION CLASSES SET RECORDS FOR GIVING, PARTICIPATION, AND ATTENDANCE



With nearly half the class attending their 40th reunion, the **Class of 1978 set a new giving record** by raising \$107,653 for their class gift—the first reunion gift ever to top \$100,000 and setting a record for a 40th reunion. The class was particularly proud that it secured a leadership challenge gift of \$10,000 by reaching 42% participation.

Total giving from alumni/ae celebrating their 5th through 50th Reunions in 2018 increased 300% over last year's reunion giving.

The **Class of 1993 set a reunion attendance record** with more than 60 classmates attending their 25th Reunion. In keeping with the attendance record, the class achieved **55% participation in their class gift**, the highest 25th reunion gift participation in 17 years. By exceeding their goal of 50% giving participation, the class unlocked a \$10,000 participation challenge match which brought the reunion gift total to \$73,884. The reunion committee designated the class gift—the largest 25th reunion gift in the last fifteen years—to financial aid.

“A 50% turnout 40 years after graduation is an outstanding testament to the bonds classmates form at BB&N. We are all part of an enduring institution. I am now a BB&N parent; the institution has evolved but maintained the values of scholarship, integrity, and kindness. 




2017-2018 SOURCES OF INCOME*





MEET KRISTINA BOERGER

Inaugural John N. Schwartz Professor of Choral Leadership and Conducting

Augsburg University has named Kristina Boerger the inaugural John N. Schwartz Professor of Choral Leadership and Conducting, beginning Fall 2018. The Schwartz Professorship supports Augsburg's 21st century choral program—combining music reflective of a pluralistic society, superior choral performance standards, and the University's commitment to civic engagement and inclusion.

Boerger most recently served as director of choral activities at DePauw University. She holds a doctorate in Choral Conducting and Literature from the University of Illinois, and has worked in public school, collegiate, and

professional settings. She's performed with numerous groups as well as being a soloist. Boerger also has founded choirs and is deeply committed to the values of inclusion, access and equity, musics of diverse cultures, and commissioning original works.

The funding for this professorship has been committed by alumnus John N. Schwartz '67 through his estate, which will sustain this into the future. Like many Augsburg choir alumni, Schwartz was not a music major. He majored in business, but found meaning in the choir and has been singing his entire life. Because of his future commitment, Schwartz is able to be an influential part of the university today and enables the university to be bold in funding education across the institution.

NEW CAPITAL INVESTMENTS IN 2017-18

Thanks to the generosity of donors, the quality and value of Augsburg's physical plant is on the rise. The Hagfors Center was completed November 2017, two days ahead of schedule and \$6 million under budget, with a project cost of \$66.2 million. The new community garden was enhanced with the planting of an apple orchard, native plants, irrigation system, and accessible planters. Hagfors' surroundings include expansive lawns, bee-inviting native flowers, and an Urban Arboretum including 98 newly planted trees and shrubs.

An additional \$1.7 million was invested in a range of on-campus improvements: information technology upgrades, an upgraded life safety alarm system in Urness and Mortensen Halls, campus signage with the name change to Augsburg University, along with a number of other smaller projects to refresh the campus experience. Another \$300,000 funded the expansion of classrooms for the growing Physician Assistant Program housed at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota.


The long-awaited replacement of the ice rink mechanical system began in April with the conclusion of the men and women's hockey season. At an estimated cost of \$4.2 million, the new rinks will be ready to welcome teams and the community back to skate in October. This is the first phase of a two-phase renovation of the Ed Saugestad competition rink and two practice rinks.



Thanks to the support of many alumni, parents, and friends of Augsburg, our



Endowed fund draws national scholar

MEET MARTY STORTZ, PH.D.

Second Bernard M. Christensen Chair, and professor of religion and vocation

For seven years now, Augsburg has served as honorary home to Martha 'Marty' Stortz. Before she accepted the call to Augsburg, Stortz served as a member of the core doctoral faculty at the Graduate Theological Union in Berkeley, Calif., and taught for 29 years at the Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary. While the winters may have been kinder at her previous stations, Stortz quickly found a home with the Minneapolis biking community in Seward, and even more quickly established her place as a theological leader, inquisitor, and guide within the Augsburg (and greater Midwestern) community. In 2010, Stortz came to us an acclaimed scholar and teacher in the realms of the church, academia, and society at large, but she's been reshaping worldviews through her research, writing, instruction on faith, and invaluable service ever since.

Since 1989, hundreds of alumni and friends of the University have donated to make the Christensen Chair a reality for Augsburg. Thank you for enabling us to draw leading educators who are committed to enriching our community.



Augsburg is taking a significant step forward this year in the value of our physical plant, thanks to donor generosity to the Hagfors Center for Science, Business, and Religion campaign, and thanks to stewardship of the University's assets. These designated investments will continue to grow, laying a crucial foundation for a stronger, more financially stable organization.

In concert with Augsburg's investment in the construction of the Hagfors Center, the University has invested an additional \$1.5 million in a range of on-campus capital improvements: information technology upgrades, a new rain garden, updated weight room and aerobic equipment, renovation of the Urness Lobby computer lab, installation of more ADA electronic door openers, paddles, and more. Following smoke damage from a small fire in our dining service, Christensen Campus Center benefited from deep cleaning, painting, furniture replacement, and other upgrades.

Art and Identity Highlight:

ROOTS THAT WILL REMAIN

Quad Elm Tree
Stephen Geffre

There are times when artistic inspiration can be elusive, but there are also times when it seems to find you. The latter was the case for artist and Augsburg art instructor, Stephen Geffre, who was on assignment in the Quad while crews removed one of many cherished trees that had fallen prey to Dutch elm disease. Among the debris, Geffre found a cross-cut (and a part of Augsburg's history) that was worth preserving. He took this 200-pound piece home and let it become the focal point and inspiration for one of Hagfors Center's Art and Identity masterpieces.

Phil Adamo, "Quad Elm Tree" sponsor and celebrated Augsburg professor and historian recalls, "For almost 75 years, half the life of the University, students, staff and faculty walked past those trees, sat in their shade, watched their leaves turn in the fall. Now, when you come down the main hallway of the first floor, you'll walk directly towards a cross-section of one of these trees, showing the history of Augsburg in its rings."

This fragment of Augsburg's story, mounted onto a piece of aluminum and adjacent to a line form re-creation of the tree, joins Augsburg's heritage with its future. Geffre affirmed, "I'm hoping that my piece bridges the gap between where the University used to be and where it's going now ... [that people may] count out the rings and say 'That's when I was here, right there. Those are my four years.'"



ENDOWMENT MARKET VALUE



Lex Dorfman '18 spent her summer in Norway studying alongside students from around the world. RESEARCH AT AUGSBURG INSPIRES STUDENTS TO EXPLORE NEW PATHS IN SCIENCE



Thomas Pho '19 was determined to go to medical school after he graduated from Augsburg until he decided to get some research experience at the end of his second year.

“One summer became a semester, and then another semester and another,” Pho said. “It was a cascade of wanting to do more research and a drive to do something unique and new. I want to be innovative and not just follow a routine.”

He joined Vivian Feng—department chair and associate professor of chemistry at Augsburg—in her research lab, and it changed his path completely. Now, as a senior, Pho has coauthored several research papers (one published, two in manuscript form) and is planning to go to graduate school to study either biochemistry or bioanalytical chemistry.

Feng’s lab has been studying nanomaterials that are used in the tech industry as well as in consumer products—e.g., particles found in your cell phone battery, antibacterial socks, and sunscreens—and the environmental impact of these materials when we’re done using them. Currently, Pho says there is no motivation to recycle lithium ion batteries, so they will likely end up in a landfill.

Pho says they want to understand the molecular impact nanomaterials have on the environment to better establish guidelines for the creation of new technology that will have a reduced impact on our world.

As research discoveries increase, Feng’s students are listed among the authors on more published, peer-reviewed journal articles. Their research, titled “Biological Impact of Nanoscale Lithium Intercalating Complex Metal Oxides to Model Bacterium *Bacillus Subtilis*,” was recently published in the journal *Environmental Science: Nano* in November 2018. Another student, Seth Frand '19, says a paper he coauthored on nanomaterials was recently sent out for peer review in another high-impact journal, *ACS Nano*.

In working with Feng, any students like Pho, Frand, and Metti Gari '20 have had the opportunity to collaborate on world-class research with other prestigious schools around the country as a part of the National Science Foundation-funded Center for Sustainable Nanotechnology. As the only undergraduate lab working on this team of nanoparticle researchers, these students have found they are treated as equals with those in graduate programs.

“It’s an amazing opportunity,” Pho said. “We’re not treated like undergrads. We are treated like real researchers, and we are able to pursue our own ideas. [Feng] is so supportive and gives us the academic freedom to be able to do that.”

The new lab spaces and equipment in the Hagfors Center, for which students offered input, also help students raise the bar on their research.

“We have a lot of great instruments installed,” Gari said. “We’ve had people from other universities come work with us on our research and they say, ‘You’re lucky to work with such nice instruments.’”

When collaborators visit these spaces, they often ask if they can run experiments here. “There is pride in the space,” Feng said.

All three students agreed the new space and functionality of the labs in Hagfors demonstrates that Augsburg made a conscientious move toward becoming a university known for student-centered research.

“It’s very inspirational to be in this building,” Pho said.



COMMUNITY CONNECTION

The Hagfors Center welcomes the neighborhood with an “open arms” design, facing the adjacent residential community and embracing the community gardens.

The Gundale Chapel has served as a place for worship, learning, and love this year including the vow renewal of Augsburg’s own Judi Green, executive assistant to the provost, and Bill Green, professor of history.

Augsburg University exceeded the Central Corridor Anchor Partnership's inclusionary contracting goal to award a minimum of **10%** of the total project cost to local, women, or minority-owned firms in a major construction project.

McGough Construction, the general contractor for the Hagfors Center for Science, Business, and Religion, relied on nearly **13%** local, women, or minority-owned firms to complete the project—an economic value of \$6,762,287.

GUNDALE CHAPEL DEDICATION CEREMONY

In December, Augsburg University hosted a dedication for the Gundale Chapel, which is named in memory of Rev. Elnar Gundale, father of Evangeline (Gundale) Hagfors.

Elnar Gundale emigrated from Norway to the United States in 1930. During the Great Depression, he studied at Augsburg and worked as a Norwegian language instructor to pay his way. He was ordained in 1937 as a Lutheran Free Church pastor and served several parishes for nearly 60 years. He and his wife Catherine raised six children. Four of them attended Augsburg.

The hanging glass sculpture draws from textile designs of many cultures and religions, both contemporary and ancient, and includes panels without patterns to suggest the future of Augsburg yet to unfold as well as smudges, blurring, and distress to imply imperfection of the world past and present.


